The subjects for Junior Cycle are made up of 6 compulsory subjects and 3 option subjects. Students will also study SPHE, Wellbeing, CSPE, PE and RE as short courses/non-examination subjects.

# **Compulsory Subjects**

All students study the following subjects to Junior Cycle Level:

- 1. Irish
- 2. English
- 3. Maths
- 4. Geography
- 5. Science
- 6. History

# **Subject Levels**

Students will be divided into Higher and Ordinary Level classes at the beginning of 2<sup>nd</sup> Year based on Christmas and Summer results in Irish English Maths

Junior Cycle - 100% Practical Work

Leaving Certificate - 70% Practical Work 30% Theory Exam Paper

An Art Portfolio is required for particular careers. They include:

- Art and Design Courses
- Computer Graphic Design Courses
- Architecture in two colleges (UL and TUD)
- Interior Design @ TUD
- Photography @ TUD and Dun Laoghaire (DLIADT)
- Product Design @ UL

#### **Business**

Junior Cycle - 90% Exam Theory Paper + 10 % Assessment Task

Leaving Certificate - 100% Exam Theory Paper

• Students will be permitted to take up any of the Business subjects as a new subject at Leaving Certificate. Business is a good subject for numerous business related courses at third level.

## Wood Technology (Construction Studies)

Junior Cycle - 70% Practical Project + 30% Theory Exam Paper

Leaving Certificate - 25% Practical Project + 25% Practical Exam + 50% Theory Exam Paper

- Construction Studies or DCG required for Construction Teaching @ ATU. UL accepts DCG or Construction Studies or Science for teaching.
- Required for specialised Furniture Design Course at Letterfrack ATU.

## Graphics (Design Communication Graphics -DCG)

Junior Cycle - 30% Project + 70% Drawing Exam Paper

Leaving Certificate - 40% Project + 60% Drawings Exam Paper

- Construction Studies or DCG required for Construction Teaching @ ATU. UL accepts DCG or Science for teaching.
- Required for entry to specialised Furniture Design Course @ ATU

## **Home Economics**

Junior Cycle - 50% Practical Food Skills Exam + 50% Theory Exam Paper
Leaving Certificate - 20% Practical Project + 80% Theory Exam Paper

- Required for Home Economics Teaching (a), St. Angela's Sligo (Science also accepted)
- Students will be permitted to take up Home Economics as a new subject for Leaving Certificate.

## **Modern Languages (French and German)**

Junior Cycle - 90% Exam Paper + 10% Assessment Task

Leaving Certificate - 25% Oral Exam (20% at Ordinary Level)

55% - Reading Comprehension/Written Production + 20% Aural

# Language requirement as detailed below.

Four NUI Universities <u>require</u> a third language for entry. (Third Language → English, Irish + one other)

They include:

- University College Cork (UCC)
- University College Dublin (UCD)
- NUI Maynooth (except for Business & Law courses)
- NUI Galway (now UCG)

The following Colleges <u>require</u> a <u>third language</u> for entry.

- Royal College of Surgeons
- Pontifical University Maynooth
- Shannon College of Hotel Management
- St. Angela's College, Sligo

The following colleges **Do Not** require a third language:

- All institutes of Technology and Technological Universities including Tralee, Cork, and Limerick
- Technological University of Dublin (TUD)
- Trinity College Dublin (TCD)
- University College Limerick (UL)
- Dublin City University (DCU)

Garda Siochana require two out of three languages (One of which must be Irish or English) Cadets require a third language.
